NetSpace, the new technology platform is coming and it will replace CNAMS as of January 2013. Once you have been invited to start using NetSpace we suggest you move to that platform. You will need to go through a series of self directed modules and pass a short hands-on assessment before you are granted access to NetSpace. You will need to plan about an hour (uninterrupted) to work through the modules.

Although it is very different from our old friend CNAMS, once you get used to navigating and working in NetSpace, we think you will see the great jump in functionality it provides for you and your students. It provides support for mobility, collaboration, social learning, is a flexible architecture for future innovations and supports the process changes we've already experienced with Academy Evolution.
