Tenure Policies Under Federal Scrutiny

A portion of a 2011 Indiana state law that would allow tenured teachers to be fired before non-tenured teachers in the case of a reduction in force is unconstitutional, according to a federal judge.

U.S. District Judge William T. Lawrence ruled Thursday that a tenured Madison Consolidated Schools teacher laid off during a reduction in force (RIF) in 2013 should not have had his contract canceled, because six non-tenured teachers were retained for positions he was certified for.

Lawrence found that a provision of a 2011 teacher Convention Center, maintain the physical layer, and respond to support needs.

- Hotel room + room tax
- Meals while at Cisco Live
- Event pass (keynote, sessions, etc.)
- · Cisco certification exam voucher

accountability law which allowed schools to consider performance rather than seniority in RIF situations violated teacher Joseph Elliott's contractual rights as a tenured teacher under the 1927 Teachers' Tenure Act.

The state and the MCS school board argued unsuccessfully that "the 'concept of tenure' does not at its core refer to the right of tenured teachers to be retained over non-tenured teachers in the event of a reduction in force."

Lawrence found that argument unpersuasive, saying to hold otherwise would be "contrary to the entire spirit and purpose of the [Teacher's Tenure] Act" and would permit administrators to do "indirectly that

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which the law expressly forbids him to do directly."

The court's ruling said state law already provided means for underperforming teachers to be terminated, and that there is "simply no basis for the repeated assertion of the state and board that" the RIF provision is necessary to protect Indiana students from "ineffective" teaching.

The ruling was hailed as a victory by the Indiana State Teacher's Association.

"It's a victory for teachers who have experience and are good at what they do," said ISTA president Teresa Meredith. "We're definitely encouraged by the verdict. It takes away the fear for an experienced teacher that because of that
